See, Say, Report!

The Hawai'i State Fusion Center accepts suspicious activity reports to include possible crimes such as fraud, violence, and acts of terrorism. Help us protect Hawai'i by submitting tips and reports online at hsfc.hawaii.gov

STEP ONE

File a police report with your local department.

If the crime or fraud took place online, please file a report with the police department for your district. If the crime or fraud happened in-person, file a report with the department in the area where the incident took place. You often need a police report number when escalating your complaint to state and federal levels.
