

# Malware Prevention, Discovery, and Recovery (MPDR)

No Cost Cybersecurity Training

## 32 Hours. Instructor-Led

An intermediate level, hands-on course where knowledge and basic experience is required.

This National Cybersecurity Preparedness Consortium (NCPC) training course is developed by the Criminal Justice Institute at the University of Arkansas System.

## Course Description Target Audience

MPDR will expose participants to analysis of malicious software used by cyber-criminals and cyber-terrorists.

After an introduction to modern malware, participants will learn how to prevent a malware outbreak, discover and identify malware through active network traffic analysis, prepare for dynamic analysis of malware samples of various types and intent, and how to isolate, re-mediate, and recover from a malware outbreak.

Finally, the course will conclude with a review of dynamic malware analysis and a look at emerging trends in the use of malicious software in network intrusions and data theft.
