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

THIRA & SPR Fundamentals	March	Review prior-year data/sources; Review foundational guidance documents	<ul> <li>Review prior-year THIRA/SPR data Pre-Submission reports, Executive Summaries, and Tear Sheets available on the URT</li> <li>Reports may also be accessed by contacting (FEMA- <u>SPR@fema.dhs.gov</u>)</li> <li>Review the Annotated THIRA/SPR guidance document for detailed example content reported in the THIRA and SPR</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Prior year THIRA and SPR data reports</li> <li><u>Annotc</u></li> <li><u>URT Re</u></li> </ul>
THIRA	March- April	Discuss threats and hazards and review scenarios	<ul> <li>Review the threats and hazards facing your community and consider whether additional or new threat/hazard scenarios should be developed</li> <li>Reach out to subject-matter experts (SMEs), local government and emergency management officials, and other preparedness stakeholders to discuss and brainstorm threat/hazard scenarios</li> <li>Begin reviewing estimated impacts for previously reported threat/hazard scenarios and estimate impacts for any new scenarios</li> <li>Update estimated impacts, as needed</li> <li>Review guidance on improving THIRA/SPR data quality</li> </ul>	<ul> <li><u>Annotc</u></li> <li><u>Improv</u></li> <li><u>THIRA/</u> <u>Guidan</u></li> <li>Existing TA Materials/Recordings: <u>THIRA:</u></li> <li><u>HSGP,</u> <u>Notice</u></li> </ul>
THIRA & SPR	April	Review THIRA/SPR reporting requirements	<ul> <li>Review any additional guidance from FEMA explaining the reporting requirements for a given assessment year</li> <li>Target reporting requirements may change based on the THIRA/SPR cycle year</li> <li>For example, in the first year of a new assessment cycle, the THIRA and SPR are required, but in years two and three, only the SPR is required</li> <li>Review materials on Core Capabilities and associated capability targets</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Target Reporting Requirements Announcements</li> <li>Assessment Completion Guides</li> <li><u>Core C</u></li> <li>Target Overview Sheets</li> <li><u>Standc</u></li> </ul>

THIRA & SPR	Мау	Review the latest URT release and become familiar with the system	<ul> <li>FEMA updates the online URT with fixes, enhancements and requirements updates for the current assessment year</li> <li>Understand how to navigate and interact with the URT before entering community data</li> <li>Review resources developed and used by other communities to engage with stakeholders and collect data</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>FEMA Preparedness Toolkit</li> <li><u>URT User Guide</u></li> <li><u>Community-Developed Resources</u> available on the URT</li> </ul>		
SPR	June, July, August	Conduct stakeholder engagement efforts and collect data	<ul> <li>Community POCs typically reach out to their respective stakeholders mid-year</li> <li>Coordinate working groups, distribute surveys or collection tools, and hold meetings to discuss capabilities and/or collect data and information</li> <li>Organize and analyze data and information collected; follow up</li> <li>with local stakeholders and/or SMEs, as needed</li> </ul>	<ul> <li><u>THIRA/SPR Elevator Speech</u></li> <li><u>THIRA/SPR Fact Sheet for Local</u> <u>Communities</u></li> <li><u>Whole Community Input Form (WCIF)</u></li> <li><u>Whole Community Contributor</u> <u>Aggregator Tool (WCCAT)</u></li> </ul>		
Data Entry	September- October	Obtain concurrence from key stakeholders, if necessary	<ul> <li>Community POCs obtain concurrence from their respective stakeholders on THIRA/SPR data to be reported</li> <li>If concurrence is required, it is recommended that communities</li> <li>meet with stakeholders early enough to discuss and revise data</li> </ul>	<ul> <li><u>Community Strategies for Identifying</u> <u>and Engaging Whole Community</u> <u>Partners</u></li> <li><u>How FEMA Uses the THIRA/SPR Data</u></li> </ul>		
	November- December	Enter data into the URT and submit to FEMA	<ul> <li>Begin entering data into the URT</li> <li>The data entry process can start earlier depending on the need for stakeholder concurrence but should begin no later than November</li> <li>After completing the THIRA, SPR, Post Assessment and</li> <li>Secondary Assessments, validate the data in the URT and submit</li> </ul>	<ul> <li><u>URT User Guide</u></li> <li><u>URT Troubleshooting Guide</u></li> <li>Assessment Completion Guides</li> </ul>		
THIRA/SPR Assessments are Due by December 31
